General Meeting Minutes for September 10, 2008.

Business Meeting

President Tony Davids called the meeting to order at 7:44 PM, at the Goodnow Library, Sudbury, MA.



The treasurer's report and secretary's meeting minutes were approved as written in the September newsletter.

Field Reports

Davis Field is in fine condition. Dick Williamson reports that Saturday mornings are reserved for Youth Soccer. There was a question about whether there may also be soccer practice on Thursday and or Friday afternoons. Check the Sudbury Youth Soccer website for up to date scheduling information. CRRC has reserved Davis for Sundays during the fall.

Bill Martin Field is in fine condition as well, especially since the film crews have left the

nearby State Hospital grounds. The brush has been cut back on the road leading into the field. It has been rumored that the Millis club has been talking with the State about removing some trees at the end of the runway to improve the landing approach zone. There was also some discussion about the possibility of erecting a simple lean-to shelter. Stay tuned!

Membership Report

Membership chair Ray Harlan reports that CRRC has 118 members on record.

There was no BOD volunteer this month.



Old Business

CRRC Soar-In. Anker Berg-Sonne gave a good report on the August Soar-In. This year there were more contestants than in the past several years. After some initial equipment problems were resolved, the contest went very well. Good feedback has been received from the contestants. Looking forward to next year's event, Anker suggests that we increase the entrance fee to account for rising food costs, or reduce the food quantity. He advocates maintaining the current fee. Look for Anker and Dave's full report in the August newsletter.

Granite State Glider Fest, Hudson, NH. CRRC members Anker Berg-Sonne, John Nilsson, and Dick Williamson snagged all the top spots in this August event. Dick won the Easy Glider contest by attrition; his plane was the only one flying at the end of the competition. Anker was in front in the unlimited category until the very end, when John took the lead by four points.

New Business

Ken Antonellis reminded all about the upcoming auction, November 16, at the Natick VFW on Route 135. Auctioneers are needed. There will be more discussion at the October meeting.

Tom Stammberger inquired if there was interest in a Fall Electric Fun Fly. Tony will pass the word along to Tom Bauer, who has organized past fun flies.

CRRC Handbook. Ray Harlan has suggested that we change the handbook format, and the method by which it is distributed. The rules part of the handbook is relatively stable, while the membership list is in a constant state of change. Suggestions have included 1) distributing the handbook electronically, to reduce the publishing and mailing costs, 2) splitting the handbook into two documents, a rule book, and a membership list, and distributing the two separately. Many members remarked that they find the hard copy membership list useful, but do not wish to have the list on the website due to security concerns. The consensus was to distribute the hard copy handbook by mail to new members, also making it available on the web (minus the member list) and to make hard copy membership lists periodically available at monthly meetings.

Tony Davids brought up an issue on behalf of Howard Hager. Howard has been exploring an EPA-AMA partnership to use the Nyanza Chemical Waste Dumpsite in Ashland as a flying site. Use of EPA superfund sites for model aviation has been the subject of recent articles in Model Aviation. Urban sprawl continues to reduce the availability of large open tracks of land that are suitable for model aviation. Taking advantage of potential new sites will help to keep our hobby alive and well. It was also suggested

that we contact the Millis club to see if they had any interest.

At a Board of Directors meeting in the spring it had been proposed to change the membership fees to include multi-year memberships, and to eliminate the early bird discount in favor of the multi-year discount, after members had expressed interest in such a change. The membership consensus was that the proposed fee structure would increase the membership chair's duties with little benefit. After much discussion, the issue was voted upon, with a majority in favor of retaining the existing dues structure.

Tom Stammberger asked if anyone knew the whereabouts of the softcopy for the CRRC information brochure. Verizon Labs is listed as the meeting location, and should be updated to list Sudbury's Goodnow Library. Fritz Bien says that he has the original document in Corel Draw, and will make it available to Tom.

Show And Tell

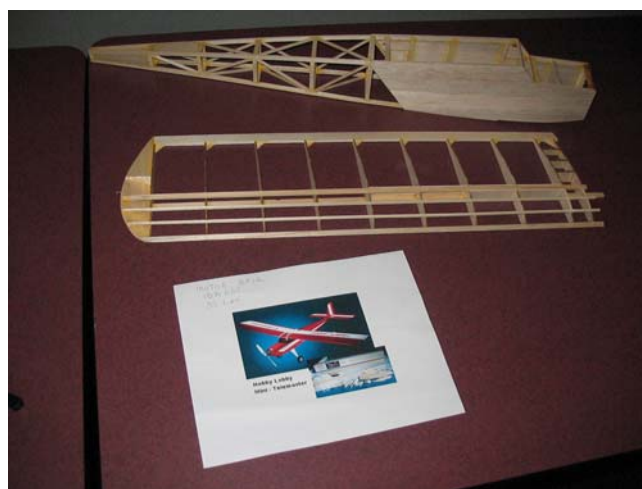
Ray Harlan brought his Electric Free Flight model for show and tell. The plane's flying

surfaces are covered with a very thin Mylar film, and are designed to meet new free flight competition rules limiting the battery to a 10-mAh-lithium cell. The battery weights 0.6 grams. Ray has logged a maximum altitude of 130 feet, and his longest flight was 39 minutes, while flying at the Lakehurst, NJ blimp hanger over Labor Day weekend. Ray attributes his successes to indoor thermals..



Larry Wetmore displayed his work-in-progress MiniTelemaster. The fuselage and two wing halves are nearing completion. This will be

Larry's first entry into the world of electric flight. The power plant will be a BP-12 CD-ROM brushless outrunner, and a 3SLipo.



Anker Berg-Sonne brought samples of his foam wing cores, cut using his newly built CNC foam cutter. Anker assembled the CNC cutter using \$500 of off-the-shelf electronic components, but he developed his own software to control it. The core samples are smooth as a baby's bottom. The hot wire cuts the foam by radiant heat, and never comes in contact with the foam. The hot wire's

kerf is a function of the temperature and speed at which it travels through the foam.



Fritz Bien displayed his scale Stearman C3D Biplane. It weighs 22 ounces and is powered with a 3 cell Lipo battery. The plane has rudder, elevator, aileron, and throttle control.



Tom Stammberger showed us his newest ducted fanjet, a 28" wingspan Great Planes Miglett. He

together. From full-scale aircraft, balloons, to RC and sailplanes, Wloclawek had it all. Sixteen countries and seventy pilots took part in the weeklong competition.

The LOT 767's pilot was a fellow competitor who assisted Team USA by personally supervising the loading of their equipment into the 767's cargo bay, and once at their destination, got the equipment through customs and trucked directly to the flying field.

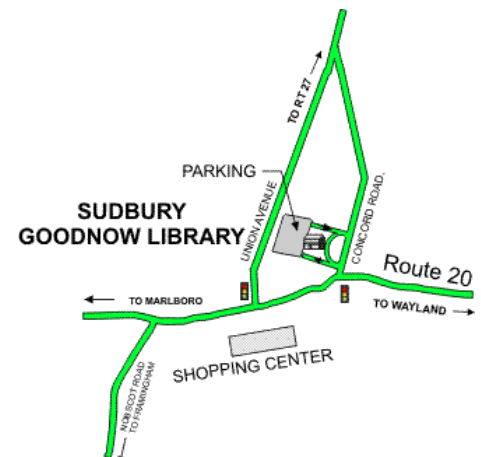

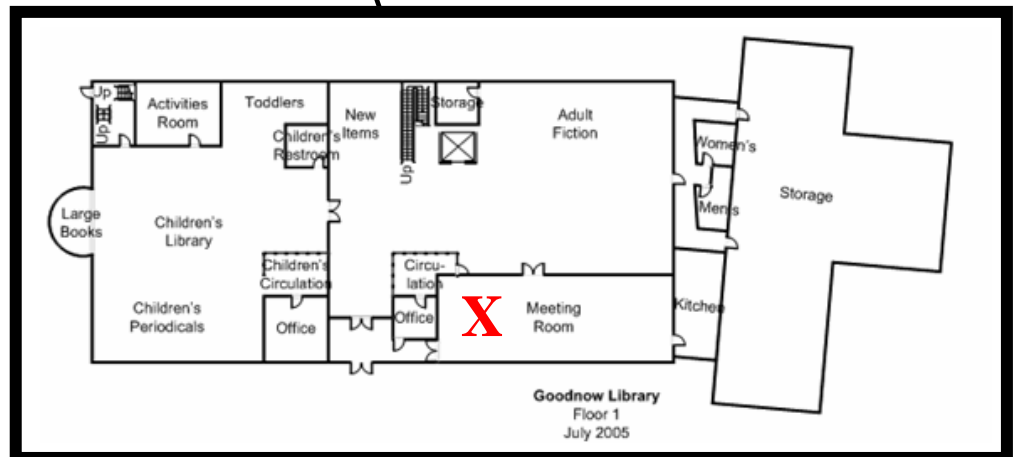
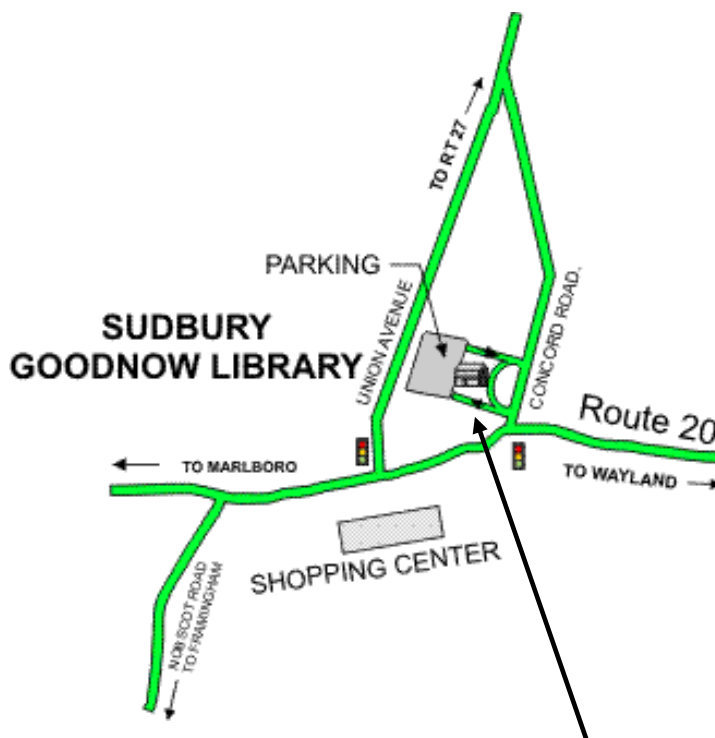
